Similarly, former Mr. America and current Life Coach, Terwilliger, will serve as co-emcee for the event. Though Terwilliger's passion for a healthy lifestyle draws him to the event, he has direct interest in the cause, as he is an identical twin and knows the severity of the event's namesake distress, Twin-to-Twin Transfusion Syndrome (TTTS).

Somers said, "Harris, Studdard and Terwilliger have been involved with us for most of the event's history. They have taken our cause and mission and helped us draw in more people with their presence, and have expanded awareness of our organization and its cause. They all are very personable and our participants love having their involvement and support of our organization."
